

"Persons with disabilities ...

... include those who have long-term physical, mental, intellectual or sensory impairments which in interaction with various barriers may hinder their full and effective participation in society on an equal basis with others."

- Article 1 CRPD



Right to health

"... recognize the right of everyone to the enjoyment of the highest attainable standard of physical & mental health .. "

- Article 12 Covenant on Economic, Social & Cultural Rights



Legal capacity

... shall accord to women, in civil matters, a legal capacity identical to that of men and the same opportunities to exercise that capacity .. "

Article 15 Convention on the Elimination of all Forms of Discrimination Against Women

- -Orientation

Social

- Non-discrimination
- Stigma
- Financial (affordability)



Participation is an obligation

"... shall closely consult with and actively involve persons with disabilities, including children with disabilities ..."

Article 4 (3) CRPD




